A former Attorney–General and Commissioner for Justice of Plateau State, he holds an LL.B (First Class Honours) degree as well as postgraduate law degrees, including a Ph.D, from renowned universities within and outside Nigeria; has been a Visiting Professor at

Canada's Osgoode Hall Law School, York University, and other prestigious institutions, and has received several meritorious awards for superlative academic performance.

A highly sought after speaker, Professor Dakas has presented over one hundred and fifty (150) papers on constitutional law, human rights, humanitarian law, international law, peace building and conflict resolution, building resilient communities and strengthening the security architecture in vulnerable communities, democratic policing, justice in transitional societies, election management, population dynamics, inter–ethnic and inter–faith dialogue and engagement, migration, refugees and IDPs, drugs and crime, corruption, economic and financial crimes, etc at workshops, roundtables, seminars and conferences, organised by several governmental and non–governmental organisations/institutions within and outside Nigeria. Outside Nigeria, Dakas has presented papers at conferences in the United States of America (USA); Canada; Italy; South Korea; etc.

Additionally, he is widely consulted by governments, inter-governmental organizations and non-governmental organizations. Rated as one of Nigeria's Top 100 lawyers, Dakas has an enviable

Professor Mutihir is currently the Chairman, Voice for Family Planning and Reproductive Health (V4FP/RH), Plateau State. In addition to his crowded work schedule as a medical consultant, he is passionate about the

less-privileged and serves on the board of ALDA Foundation.

WHO WE ARE

AZUMI LADI DANAT (ALDA) FOUNDATION is a humanitarian initiative committed to promoting human welfare. It was founded by businesswoman Azumi Ladi Danat whose passion is to give hope to the poor and needy by empowering orphans, vulnerable children and widows; to provide health care services, education, make advocacy on rape, drug use, women and child's rights and related issues. Our mission is implemented through our programmes, outreaches and activities which enable the Foundation to dignify its beneficiaries by focusing on health, education, empowerment and advocacy.

In central Nigeria where our presence is strong, the ongoing insecurity has further impoverished the dominantly agrarian families and communities.

We recognize that the indigent, vulnerable, widows and the needy can add value to themselves and to society if some of these barriers are cleared off their way. Therefore, our work is to give them a chance to make their lives more productive.













Our Focus Areas Goals, Objectives and SDG Link Up, Health, Education & Empowerment

- To work with spirited individuals, donors and experienced medical practitioners such as consultants, cardiologists, obstetrics and gynaecologists, ophthalmologists, paediatricians, epidemiologists, neurologists, pharmacists, lab scientists, nurses and surgeons and rendering special medical services to the indigents in central Nigeria.
- To execute programmes aimed at basic health care services (preventive and curative) including maternal health, child health, safe drinking water, hygienic sanitation, management of waste disposal, population welfare, immunization, etc. leading towards reduced mortality.
- To improve health conditions by providing basic health and hygiene education and services to the communities residing in neglected areas. To build and create awareness on malaria, TB and other infectious diseases in our communities. To enhance productive livelihood and well-being for people living with HIV/AIDS and their families.
- To eliminate drug and substance abuse through launching programmes aimed at rehabilitation of drug addicts
- To improve the socio-economic status of the rural and urban poor.
- -To alleviate poverty and unemployment through youth and women empowerment
- To involve ourselves in the social empowerment of youths (orphans, street children) through community events such as capacity-building, youth trainings, and social activities which bring our youths and communities together.
- Creating avenue for advocacy for human rights, peaceful resolution of conflicts and sustain socio-economic development among the marginalized communities. To educate the deprived and under privilege common folk about their basic human rights.
- To advocate for a society whereby children and youth with disabilities have equal rights and opportunities for growth and development.
- Improved access to education and psycho-social well-being of marginalized children and youth.

To achieve its goal and objectives, ALDA Foundation's intervention generally focuses on the following areas:

- 9. Providing opportunities for Orphans, Vulnerable Children and widows These 9 areas are addressed under three main programs:

HEALTH

Health support is key to the Foundation's work. We aim is to deliver good health care services for the vulnerable, orphans, widows and less privileged in communities where we operate. This mission is linked to Goal 3 of the SDGs.

By this intervention we seek to address health concerns through:



- Periodic and free medical check-ups and outreaches
- •Awareness and precaution measures related to malaria, HIV, TB, hepatitis, reproductive health and sexual rights.
- Child health and nutrition related programs
- •Develop immunization programs for venereal diseases and epidemics
- •Organizing events for public health in collaboration with government
- •Outreaches reaching out to those in need of medical and necessities such as food items and clothing
- •Distribution of Medical aid and suppliers, to primary health care's centres, in the rural areas visited.

We do this because we understand that healthy people can be more productive to themselves and to society.

LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

Under this scheme we seek to empower our beneficiaries to generate more income. This ties in with the mission of Goals 1 and Goal 8 (Decent work and economic growth). We focus on vocational education and skills development. This will empower our beneficiaries to live more financially stable lives. Other forms of livelihood support include:

- •youth empowerment where we create youth support groups to address problems such as drug use, crime teenage pregnancy, unemployment, HIV/AIDS affecting the youth population of communities where we operate
- women empowerment
- •Job creations job opportunities are created if non-governmental organizations including **ALDA Foundation** continuously engage of both experts and technical support staff for humanitarian outreaches.

- child education and development
- vocational training
- •scholarship. Currently, there are 18 students under ALDA scholarship. Among them are orphans and vulnerable children

OUR STRATEGY

















Our approach is adapted to suit our core values and our target audience who are less-privileged.

Community mobilization

To implement our programs and outreaches, our first step is to mobilize the community to raise awareness on health, hygiene and nutrition. We meet with local authorities, community members, conduct training/capacity building sessions and launch campaigns. To achieve our education support program, at donor's request we connect the potential sponsors with schools so they can directly sponsor a beneficiaries' education.

Use of voluntary service from both local and international volunteers.

Capacity building of community-based groups, women groups, youth groups, and people with disability groups.

Linkages and collaboration with various stakeholders, Civil Society Organizations, NGO and government departments.

House hold-centered approaches that link OVC services with HIV-affected families and strengthening community structures which protect and promote healthy child development such as churches, child area advisory councils/ committees

Social support including vocational training, income generating activities, social & legal protection and prevention services including positive behavior counseling.

Sustaining relationships with our beneficiaries by giving them the utmost attention through some of our partners who are medical experts, for both the treatment and post-treatment reviews.











TEAM of volunteers

Meet like-minded people impacting lives through ALDA Foundation. Our volunteers are key to our results. They come from different walks of life to play different volunteer roles - from message delivery, mobilization, logistics, physical involvement. These heroes, disguised as ordinary people, tell you a little about what inspires them to volunteer their time to us.

KATLONG

Katlong is a pharmacist, his first and major role is the dispensing of drugs during the medical outreach. He has also been involved in drug forecasting, drug procurement and drug use analysis and prescription of drugs for patients when the need arises. He has helped in coordinating the activities of the pharmacy unit.

To Katlong, 'volunteering is my own little way of giving back to the community, and also to show appreciation to God for bringing me from a very long way'.

He was 'inspired by the passion of the founder, and other members of the Foundation' to 'get involved in putting a smile on the faces of people in our community'. He remembers his sense of fulfilment: 'I enjoy the smiles on the faces of the communities we are attending to, their gratitude to us for reaching out to them at the point of their needs, the beautiful atmosphere of unity and camaraderie amongst all the members of the team and the entire foundation, and the leadership and motherly role of the founder.'

He learnt lessons getting involved: 'I have learnt that sacrifice is also an act of service to God. I have learnt that alone, we can do so little, but together we can do so much more. Finally, what we do for ourselves, dies with us, but what we do for others and the world, remains and is immortal.'

The entire [Kagu 2021] outreach was unforgettable for me. It was a massive crowd that turned out to receive help and care. I also enjoyed the evening conversations with colleagues, sharing experiences and learning from one another.

His key takeaway on volunteering: "In all aspects of life there are always challenges ranging from funding and personnel hopefully will be better."














What We Do -Area of Operation and Target Group

Influenced by the development paradigm that people matter more than things, we seek to create measurable impact across target communities in central Nigeria. Our target group is the reason we operate. In this category are orphans, vulnerable children, people living with HIV and AIDS, people with disabilities, widows and the less privileged. These people are found in rural and urban centres alike.

PROGRAMS

At the heart of our activities and outreaches is the philosophy that we rise by lifting others and people matter more than things. Based on this belief, we are currently engaged in three programmes in the areas of health, empowerment and education. Our programmes are designed to dignify the life of our individual beneficiaries. The programs to advance our goals include:

Access to health care in rural communities of Pankshin Local Government Area (LGA) as in many communities in Nigeria, is disturbingly poor. This is resultant from a myriad of challenges faced including poor funding, low human capacity, inavialbility of work equipment, and in some situations, the high cost of out of pocket expense for community members who can bare afford self sustainance. Our annual outreaches has created an opportunity for us to target one community at a time and provide humanitarian aid, medical services and counselling to people within and in close proximity to the communities of implementation. One of such was the outreach to Kagu community in January 2022, which facilitated the distribution of relief items inuding food and non food items (wrappers,



shoes etc) to households and medical aid items (wheel chairs, walking sticks, eye glasses, drugs and medical services) to community members. Through the conduct of the outreach 12 eye suggerries were conducted. One of the beneficirries Mrs Nater (not her real name) who had been experiencing hazy visions that made active farming difficult for here had her eyes operated upon during the outreaxh. 4 months down the line she was excited to testify of how this outreach has impacted her, improving her human dignity as she is now now able to return to her farming wihtout waiting to be supported.

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



JIBLIK MEDICAL OUTREACH ON THE PLATEAU

There was a great jubilation when the medical team arrived the different venues for the medical outreach. ALDA Foundatio led by the CEO took the initiative to divide the medical team into three groups to enable it cover the three communities earmarked for the program which included Lankan, Asa (which was stationed in Akong) and Jiblik. Each of the teams had different sections of the medical profession such as Surgeons, Opticians, Ophthalmologists Pharmacists, Lab Technicians/ Lab Scientists, Nurses, Records and Attendants whom are all professionals in there respective fields.

The community people, in their thousands marveled at the consultations, treatment and surgeries.

The Foundation was able to conduct 130 surgeries which included Myomectomy, Appendectomy, Lumpectomy, Cystectomy, Ganglion Excision, Herniorrhaphy, Hydrocoelectomy etc.

It also distributed 500 pairs of glasses and treated 600 eye patients who also received eyedrops. Also, eye surgeries were performed on 100 people. In addition, the Foundation was able to treat 4000 people in all the centers for Malaria and 3000 people for Typhoid in Lankan, Asa and Jiblik centers. HBsg and HCV test were carried out on 3550 people in all the centers, 150 were reactive and were treated. The non reactive people were admonished and advised to take vaccine. Due to the vulnerability of the communities, 3000 people were treated for Infection in the centers.

The Foundation did not only stop at a medical outreach but also looked into different aspects of life of the people in the community as it is no longer news that hunger these days kills faster than some sicknesses. The Foundation donated 10 bags of grains and some packs of seasoning to some of the communities. It also gave out 400 wrappers to the aged. The people living with disability went home smiling with wheelchairs, Walking Frames, Crutches and Walking sticks as the Foundation gave out 300 wheelchairs, 100 walking frames, 150 crutches and 50 walking sticks to the individuals. The communities went into tears of joy as

it was expressed by some beneficiaries who testified that this was the first of it's kind in their communities. They wish they had more people with such a kind heart to reach to their aid. People in their numbers came from far and near for this show of benevolence. A woman in one of the centers who had given up on her life testified that she had gone places looking for financial assistance for her ailment but the ALDA Foundation came to her rescue by performing the surgery on her without collecting a dime during the free medical outreach. She prayed in tears that the CEO, the team and the foundation shall keep on succeeding and going into different places to assist the less privileges. The Foundation also looked into the security aspects of the communities which necessitated it to distribute 1000 pairs of boots to the professional hunters and vigilantes to help them secure the land better.
